Dear Eric:

In response to your inquiry, we reviewed the New York City Department of Transportation Size and Weight Restrictions and have confirmed the following dimensional restrictions for New York City:

- 1. Length of truck - 35 ft.
- 2. Length of tractor-trailer - 55 ft;
- 3. Width - 8 ft.
- Total gross weight: 73,280 lbs. 4.
- 5. Height: 13 ft - 6 inches.

Please note that a 53-feet trailer is allowed to travel through New York City to reach destinations on Long Island using a very specific route that includes:

I-95 from the Bronx/Westchester County line to I-295;

I-295 between I-95 to the Throgs Neck Bridge to the Long Island Expressway (I-495) and

I-495 between I-295 and the Queens/Nassau County line.

Trailers of 53 feet are not allowed to make pickups or deliveries in New York City.

Furthermore, if a driver or company is found guilty of violating the above height and width restrictions, the fines to increase with each subsequent conviction.

Finally, the New York City Department of Transportation will issue a "Daily Over Dimensional Truck Permit" for a single use trip within New York City for any dimension exceeding the above limits, but only for trucks/trailers carrying indivisible loads.
